- Form 700 Statement of Economic Interest for each director and contractor is due to the San Diego City Clerk by the filing deadline of April 1. Willdan is monitoring the preparation of the forms to ensure timely filing by all parties.



In May, twenty two (22) MFR permits were issued and \$36,960 one-time special taxes collected. Annual special tax levy on the units will be \$27,368 commencing in FY 2015-16.






BACKGROUND: The North City West JPA carries liability and errors and omissions insurance through the San Diego County Schools Risk Management JPA.

### **MITIGATION AGREEMENT & LIMITED RELEASE**

This Mitigation Agreement and Limited Release ("Agreement") is entered into effective the 28th day of April 2015 (the "Effective Date"), between, on the one hand, MKSRV Solana Carmel Creek LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("MKSRV"); and, on the other hand, North City West School Facilities Financing Authority ("NCWSFFA"), as the final agreement between MKSRV and NCWSFFA regarding the amount of school facility or development impact mitigation necessary to mitigate the impacts of students generated from the MKSRV project, as detailed below. Both MKSRV and NCWSFFA are referenced herein at times collectively as the "Parties."

### RECITALS

This Agreement is made with reference to the following facts and circumstances:

A. <u>The MKSRV Project</u>: MKSRV is developing a multi-family residential development in the Carmel Valley area of San Diego County (APN numbers 307-023-38 and 307-023-40, the "Project"). The legal description of the Project is attached hereto as Exhibit "A." When completed, the Project will consist of a 181-unit multifamily apartment development.

B. NCWSFFA is a Joint Powers Authority created and administered by its members, the Del Mar Union, Solana Beach and San Dieguito Union School Districts (the "Districts"). NCWSFFA's primary responsibility is to ensure that appropriate mitigation/financing is provided for the Districts' school facilities within the North City West/Carmel Valley area consistent with its formational documents and as approved by the City of San Diego ("City").

C. NCWSFFA has informed MKSRV that the Project is within the North City West/Carmel Valley planning area, and is thus subject to the school facilities mitigation requirements in the North City West School Facilities Master Plan adopted and approved by the City and the Districts. Accordingly, NCWSFFA contends that the Project is required to pay "Direct Deposit" school mitigation fees (the "Direct Deposit Fees") or provide for other alternative mitigation/financing that ensures that the impacts of the students generated by the Project on school facilities are appropriately mitigated.

D. NCWSFFA and MKSRV have met and discussed the standards for mitigation of such impacts under applicable State law and the North City West/Carmel Valley planning documents and have agreed that it is in their mutual best interest to enter into this Mitigation

Agreement to ensure that appropriate funding/financing is available as necessary to mitigate the impacts of the students generated by the Project on the Districts' school facilities.

E. This Agreement resolves all such mitigation funding/financing issues, and provides for the creation of a new Community Facilities District which shall be solely for the Project (the "New CFD").

F. MKSRV's participation and cooperation in implementing this Agreement is intended to constitute complete mitigation of the impact of the development of the Project upon NCWSFFA and the Districts in lieu of any Direct Deposit Fees, or any other fees which the NCWSFFA and/or the Districts might have imposed, or be able to impose, on the Project pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 or Government Code Sections 65970, *et seq.* and 65995, *et seq.* as applicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants contained herein, the undersigned agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Agreement is to establish a method of funding the school facilities needed to house potential students generated by the Project and to operate and maintain such school facilities. By entering into this Agreement and complying with its terms, MKSRV shall be deemed to have fulfilled and mitigated their entire obligation to assist in funding school facilities to house the Project students pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 *et seq.*, Government Code Sections 65970, *et seq.* and/or 65995, *et seq.* as applicable.
- 2. Community Facilities District. NCWSFFA shall, within one hundred eighty (180) days from the Effective Date, create the New CFD through its designated consultants and legal counsel. This time period may be extended by mutual written agreement of the parties, or if a delay is caused by events outside NCWSFFA's or the Districts' control. The first fifty-thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) of NCWSFFA's costs for such New CFD creation incurred from outside vendors (such as NCWSFFA consultants and law firms) shall be split equally (50/50) between the Parties, with MKSRV to reimburse NCWSFFA a maximum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) within thirty days after detailed invoices are provided. All of NCWSFFA's costs in excess of the first fifty-thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be paid solely by NCWSFFA. MKSRV agrees, at MKSRV's own expense, to assist NCWSFFA in the creation of such New CFD, and take all actions reasonably necessary as the property owner to help NCWSFFA form the New CFD, including, but not limited to, aiding NCWSSFFA in forming the New CFD so that it can authorize the levy of the special tax for the Payment referenced below, along with associated analysis and arguments. The Parties agree to work cooperatively, in creating the New CFD. Prior to the actual creation of the New CFD, MKSRV has the right, to be reasonably exercised by it, to approve any and all formal CFD documents before they are used. The New CFD shall either be promptly dissolved by NCWSSFA upon receipt of the Payment discussed below, or if NCWSFFA desires to keep it in existence after the Payment is received, neither MKSRV (including its successors and assigns) or the Property shall be charged by the New

CFD, NCWSFFA, or the Districts for anything related to the New CFD, and will have no responsibilities of any kind related to it. Immediately upon receipt of the Payment through the New CFD as described herein, NCWSFFA shall record a Notice of Cessation of special tax pursuant to Government Code section 53330.5 stating that the obligation to pay the special tax has ceased and the lien imposed by the recordation of the Notice of Special Tax Lien as part of the formation of the New CFD is extinguished. 3. <u>Mitigation Obligation/Payment through New CFD Funding</u>. Upon the earlier of: (a) three (3) years from the Effective Date; or (b) the date of issuance to MKSRV of a final Permanent Certificate of Occupancy for the Project (the "Payment Date"), MKSRV shall pay to NCWSFFA through the New CFD (and in accordance with the terms and conditions of the New CFD's formational documents) two-million dollars (\$2,000,000) as a full and complete mitigation payment for the Project's impact on school facilities (the "Payment"), expressly conditioned on all the following:

a. In the case of the three-year date stated above, MKSRV is still pursuing the Project (thus, for example, if MKSRV has abandoned the Project, it does not have to make the Payment);

b. In the case of the Permanent Certificate of Occupancy for the Project stated above, MKSRV shall make the Payment concurrent with its receipt of that Permanent Certificate of Occupancy for the Project; and

c. Neither the NCWSFFA, its constituent Districts, nor any other State or local agency has demanded school facility or impact fees, or any other school-related mitigation from MKSRV other than the obligations/payments addressed in this Agreement.

- 4. <u>Agreement Approval By NCWSFFA Board</u>. This Agreement is expressly conditioned upon the NCWSFFA Board of Directors approving it and authorizing a designated signatory to sign it. Once such approval has been made by the NCWSFFA Board of Directors, proof of same shall be provided to MKSRV.
- 5. <u>Voiding Of Agreement/Tolling</u>. MKSRV is entering into this Agreement based on the representation and warranty hereby made by NCWSFFA that NCWSFFA is the sole entity authorized to assess the Project with any mitigation school impact/facility fees (which include, but are not limited to fees, charges, or general or special taxes for school facilities or costs). Should some other entity claim the right to require the Project to pay any sort of school impact or school facility mitigation fees, MKSRV shall have the unilateral right to void this Agreement upon

written notice to NCWSFFA. The effect of such notice shall be a voiding of this Agreement, and a concurrent tolling of all claims between the Parties from the Effective Date through the date of that notice, so that the Parties are in no way prejudiced by the passage of time. If the Payment has not yet been made when the notice is sent, MKSRV will be relieved of its obligation to make the Payment. If the Payment has already been made prior to the notice being sent, then NCWSFFA shall return the Payment to MKSRV within 30 days of receipt of the notice.

- 6. Limited Release By NCWSFFA. Subject to, and conditioned on, its receipt of the Payment and no voiding of this Agreement by MKSRV, NCWSFFA, on behalf of itself and its constituent Districts, hereby releases MKSRV from any and all school facility mitigation or development impact fees, costs, taxes, or other exactions, and agrees that the Payment satisfies all such in full. NCWSFFA agrees that once the Payment is made, MKSRV is released from any and all additional mitigation obligations of any type relative to the Project's impact on the Districts' school facilities, and that neither NCWSFFA nor its constituent Districts shall further assess MKSRV in any manner for school-related fees or charges, including but not limited to any fees, general or special taxes, or charges for any continuing existence or operation of the New CFD. NCWSFFA agrees that neither it nor the Districts shall make further demand for, or impose on the Project, any additional impact fees (including but not limited to school fees), general and special taxes, or other exactions, including any for the existence or operation of the New CFD. However, the foregoing release shall not restrict the Districts from seeking approval of any future general obligation bonds or special taxes for the construction, maintenance or operation of school facilities to be approved by the electorate of the applicable District, so long as such bonds or taxes apply to the entirety of the applicable District and are not just applicable to the Project or the New CFD.
- 7. <u>Waiver of Right to Protest</u>. Execution of this Agreement is made by MKSRV without protest. MKSRV knowingly and willingly waives their right of protest as may be afforded by Government Code Sections 66020 or any other substantive or procedural provision of law, but only as to NCWSFFA and the Districts, and only as to the amount of school facility or development impact mitigation necessary to mitigate the impacts of students generated from the MKSRV project, as covered by this Agreement.
- 8. <u>NCWSFFA Acknowledgement of Mitigation/Issuance of Certificate(s) of</u> <u>Compliance</u>. NCWSFFA acknowledges that the compliance with terms of this Agreement makes adequate provision for school facilities needed to house the students generated by the Project. Following execution of this Agreement by the Parties, NCWSFFA shall provide MKSRV a written Certificate(s) of Compliance for the Project so that MKSRV may obtain building permits for the Project. NCWSFFA shall also execute letters or other written materials, as reasonably requested by MKSRV or the City, describing this Agreement and stating that adequate provision for school facilities necessary to house the students generated by the Project has been made in connection with development of the Project.

- 9. <u>Agreement Unaffected By Changes in Law.</u> NCWSFFA and MKSRV agree that each Party has negotiated in good faith to reach accord on this Agreement, and as such, the Agreement is a legally binding contract between the Parties, enforceable by its terms. The Parties agree that to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Agreement shall not be affected, modified, or annulled by any subsequent change in local, state or federal law.
- 10. <u>No Admissions</u>: The undersigned understand, acknowledge, and agree that the execution of this Agreement is a compromise of disputed claims and this is not to be construed as an admission of liability on the part of any of the Parties as to those disputed claims.
- 11. <u>Warrants</u>: Each party represents and warrants that it has not heretofore assigned, transferred, or purported to assign or transfer any liability, claim, demand, action, cause of action or right herein released and discharged, and shall indemnify the other Parties from and against: (a) any liability, claim, demand, action, cause of action or right so assigned or transferred in violation of the foregoing representation and warranty; and (b) any and all liability, loss, claim, expense and/or obligation arising directly or indirectly out of its breach of the foregoing representation or warranty.
- 12. <u>California Law</u>: This Agreement is deemed made and executed in the State of California and in all respects shall be interpreted, enforced and governed by and under the laws of the State of California.
- 13. <u>Attorney's Fees And Costs</u>: If any action or proceeding is brought to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to an award of all incurred attorneys' fees and costs.
- 14. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This Agreement (i) constitutes the Parties' entire agreement, including all terms, conditions, definitions, warranties, representations, and covenants, with respect to the subject matter hereof, (ii) merges all prior discussions and negotiations between or among any or all of them as to the subject matter hereof, and (iii) supersedes and replaces all terms, conditions, definitions, warranties, representations, covenants, agreements, promises and understandings, whether oral or written, with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may not be amended, altered or modified except by a writing signed by all Parties hereto.
- 15. <u>Cooperation</u>: Each Party hereto agrees to perform any further acts and execute and deliver any further documents reasonably necessary to carry out the provisions of this Agreement.
- 16. <u>Notices</u>: All notices between the Parties related to this Agreement shall be sent via overnight delivery service to:

- 18. <u>Authority</u>: Any individual signing this Agreement on behalf of an entity represents and warrants that he/she is duly authorized to sign and make this Agreement on behalf of said entity.
- 19. <u>Binding On Successors And Assigns</u>. This Agreement is binding on all successors and assigns of the Parties.
- 20. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Signatures of the Parties may be obtained by facsimile or e-mail and shall be considered effective upon delivery to the other Party.
- 21. <u>Recordation</u>. NCWSFFA shall have the right to record a copy of this Agreement in the Official Records of the Recorder for the County of San Diego.
